A Message from Pastor Jeff Laustsen~

“But be doers of the word, and not merely hearers who deceive themselves.” – James 1:22.

Labor Day is a federal holiday observed on the first Monday in September that celebrates the economic and social contributions of workers. Since the 19th Century, the day has been set aside to pay tribute to the contributions and achievements of American workers. It also symbolizes the unofficial end of summer, and is celebrated with parties, parades, and athletic events in communities across both the United States and Canada.

Labor Day has also had another meaning for many people: it means that summer vacation is over, and school is about to begin. While it was meant to be a holiday (and was the weekend when my family gathered at Culver Lake for our annual Laustsen family picnic), it was a day of sadness for me and my friends, because it meant that within a matter of days we would once again have to go back to school, back to our regular routines, and back to coming home to homework. Labor Day for us meant that it was time to get back to work.

While Labor Day is neither the beginning of a new calendar year nor a new church year, for many congregations Labor Day marks the beginning of a new year of church activity. The Sunday after Labor Day is traditionally Rally Day, when we begin a new year of Christian education in our Sunday schools. September is the beginning of many new activities in our congregations; it is also a time when we welcome many newcomers who are searching for a church home. Even though the church never takes a “summer vacation” (as we hear in our Communion service, *“it is indeed right, our duty and our joy, that we should **at all times and in all places** give thanks and praise to you, almighty and merciful God, through our Savior Jesus Christ”*), it is a time when the slower pace of summer is replaced by the renewed energy of our fall programs. Labor Day reminds us as Christians that it is time for us to be *“doers of the word,”* to get to work on the ministry our Lord has entrusted to us as the Body of Christ.

For the people of St. John’s, this Labor Day brings with it a unique time of celebration as the congregation celebrates its 100th anniversary of mission and witness to the Lynbrook community. It is the culmination of many months of hard work and dedication on the part of many people, and this month’s celebration will be a time to give thanks to God for all who have labored at St. John’s so that the love of God may be known to all. It is my privilege as coverage pastor to share this time of celebration with you, and to work with you during these days of transition and discernment as you begin your second century in service to our Lord and Savior.

I hope you all had a great summer (I have fond memories of our trip to Utah and our time on the beach in Cape May, NJ); but now that Labor Day is here, it’s time to get back to work in the name of Jesus Christ!

St. John's had a busy summer. Council met on Aug 7th with Pastor Jeff Laustsen and all went well. Council began work on putting together the Ministry Site Profile. In trying to be sure our worship services continued without a pastor, we had a wonderful worship experience on Sunday August 26th. Since we did not have traditional pastoral coverage, Bruce Feltkamp and Dorothy Richetti agreed to preside at our Sunday Worship. Dorothy spoke to us in an inspiring and heartfelt sermon about communion and faith in our Lord. In relating her own personal experience in faith, she touched so many of us who are on their own journeys of faith. The previous week Pastor Ernst Pflug consecrated enough communion wafers so we would be able to have communion at the Aug. 26th worship. With Judy at the organ and Bruce in the chancel, communion became a wonderful community experience. Bruce chose to have communion in the round with each member giving the bread and wine to the person next to them while saying the words of Christ and ending with the sharing coming back to Bruce. It was such a beautiful, personal experience and truly gave us a deeper sense of what it means to be members of St. John's church community. We are thankful that St. John's is blessed with these three dedicated members to guide us in our worship.

In Other church news: Starting on September 16th Pastor Annemarie Noto will be with us every Sunday to lead us in word and sacrament. Council and the Worship committee have agreed that during our pastoral vacancy we would benefit by having one service each Sunday. We decided that a common convenient time for all members would be to continue with the 9:30 AM worship schedule. So please note that there will be no Winter Schedule change this year. This also means that Sunday School will be held at 9:30 AM as well as the Youth Group meetings. Please watch the bulletin for times each week.

Our 100th Anniversary celebration is fast approaching. On Sept 30th we will have a special 10 AM service. Please note that this is a special time because we had already made arrangements with Bishop Rimbo to preach at the service and for the following reception at Pompeii Restaurant.

Please respond with your payment as soon as possible so final arrangements can be made.

You may have noticed that the parsonage is active again! That is because on August 10th Pastors Michael and Terri Church and their 5 year old son Theodore have moved in. Pastor Terri and Michael were missionaries to Romania and have returned to the US. The NY Synod, who sponsor our missionaries have rented the parsonage from St. John's so the Church family has a place to live while they wait for a call or we have need of the house for our future pastor. This is truly a blessing for St. John's because it gives us an additional income and keeps the house occupied. Both Pastors have offered their services to preach if we have a need. Theodore is already enrolled in the Kindergarten Center in Lynbrook school district. We welcome Terri, Michael and Theodore to our community.

BUILD A SCARECROW

To make this possible, were looking for donations of the following items to use for the scarecrow creations:

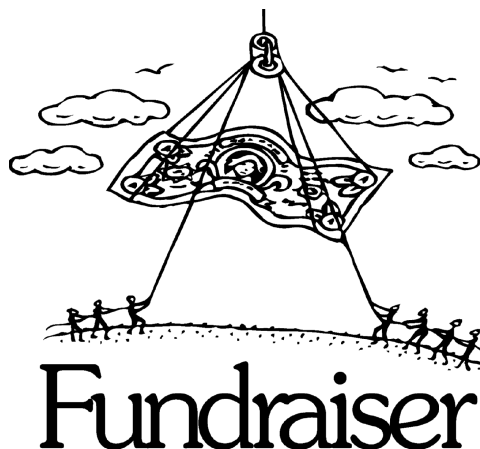
1. Long sleeve shirts (Flannels preferably for the authentic scarecrow look, adult or children sizes)
2. Pants...denim or carpenter pants or whatever you can spare. (again, adult or children sizes)
3. Any wood or lumber that could be used to make the armatures for the scarecrows. Just need something in the shape of a cross to put in the sleeves and provide support for when the scarecrows are mounted in the ground.

The plan is to stuff the clothes with newspapers and hay, attach a head to the scarecrow, and then attach it to an armature so the scarecrow can be planted in your yard.

If you have any of these items that you would be willing to donate, or if you come across any of these items at a garage sale, thrift store etc please set them aside and place them in the bin in the Narthex.
