A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ALEX...

"I would rather sit on a pumpkin and have it all to myself, than be crowded on a velvet cushion." ~ Henry David Thoreau

Picture a pumpkin. What comes to mind? Probably quite a few things, especially during this time of year! Maybe it's carving pumpkins into fun and spooky jack-o'-lanterns or going to a pumpkin patch where gourds abound in all shapes and sizes. (In past years we've gone to Crossroads Farm at Grossmann's in Malverne with the youth to pick pumpkins for our annual Harvest Festival. Hopefully we can do both again in 2021!) Or perhaps your taste buds are at work and you are thinking of a particular food or beverage like pumpkin pie with whipped cream, a pumpkin spice latte from Starbucks or a pumpkin ale served in a cinnamon-lined glass. Yummy! There's Cinderella's carriage, the Headless Horseman, Peter Peter Pumpkin Eater, and my personal favorite – Linus waiting for the Great Pumpkin!

Pumpkins are not only widely recognized as a symbol of Halloween and the autumn season – a resilient fruit that Kitty Jackson states, "lives in the 'in–between', symbolizing transition and movement toward the darker times" – but they can also teach us a lot about ourselves and the relationship we have with God and one another. They remind us that we too come in a variety of shapes, sizes, and colors, and like pumpkins we are created and handpicked to bring joy to others. God chooses us in love and removes "the guts" of our sin through the waters of baptism so that we can shine with the light of Christ. Giving thanks for this amazing gift and all the countless blessings in our lives, we are moved with gratitude to share what we have been given with those in need.

This will be our theme for our first Sunday School session following worship on Sunday, October 25th via Zoom. Sunday School students will receive take-home bags ahead of time filled with various pumpkin-themed crafts and activities that we will use with our lesson on 10/25. Please make sure to register for Sunday School if you haven't done so already!

We will also be inviting the Sunday School children and their families to make a "grateful pumpkin" this fall by writing down the things they are grateful for onto a pumpkin. This is a fun activity that anyone can do! All you need is a pumpkin and a Sharpie; no carving required! Starting at the top, write the words "We are grateful for..." (or if you're doing this on your own, "I am grateful for...") in a spiral around the stem. Then, every night – perhaps around



dinnertime – add a few things that you are grateful for. Start with the most important (family members, friends, pets, your home, God's love for us in Jesus, etc.) before adding other fun things like ice cream, reading, and family game nights. By the end of November, your pumpkin will be filled with things you are grateful for, and you will have a beautiful centerpiece for your Thanksgiving dinner table! With everything we've been through this year, focusing on our blessings and what we are grateful for is even more important.

Will you join me in giving thanks and sharing the love of "Gourd?" 😊

If you are interested in donating, reply to this email as outlined below, indicating how many gifts you would like to donate. You may request a specific age range, gift type (clothes/toys/etc.), and/or a price range. You can also request to sponsor one individual by supplying all 3 gifts for that person, if you choose. **On a first response basis, you will be assigned gifts that match your requests as best as possible based on what is still available.** Please respond early for best selection. Email reminders/updates will be sent each week until gifts are fulfilled.

You may request to participate in any of the following ways:

- In the narthex, there will be a sheet where you can sign in a request leaving your name, phone number, and number of gifts you'd be interested in donating.

Once you are assigned a gift, a virtual tag with gift information will be emailed (or texted or mailed if you prefer) to you with instructions.

Donations need to be returned no later than Sunday, December 6th. Gifts can be returned, unwrapped, in any of the following ways:

- Drop off in the assigned box in the narthex before or after church service, or anytime convenient (by calling ahead).
- Drop off in the outside drop off box at St. John-Incarnation, near the outside entrance to the Knotty Pine Room.
- Call the phone numbers as listed above for pick-up of your gifts.

It is essential to begin and end this project early in order to get the gifts to their recipients in time for the holidays. Your generosity will bring joy to someone in need this holiday season and will reinforce the true meaning of Christmas.
