PASTOR'S 2020 REPORT

My first report seven years ago highlighted some of my "firsts" as an ordained pastor, from my first time consecrating the bread and wine at the Lord's Table to my first baptism, which coincidentally occurred during my <u>first</u> week at St. John's! Needless to say I learned a whole lot during that first year, and while there may have been a few surprises here and there, it never felt like anything I couldn't handle or was unprepared for. I was confident in my call, and for the most part I knew what to expect. For the most part ©

Fast forward to 2020 – another year full of firsts, albeit mostly unforeseen and unimaginable ones! The COVID-19 pandemic that began in early March forced us to make quick changes and try new things. Some of these firsts ended up being incredible blessings for us; others, however, felt like anything but – our first Easter and Christmas Eve apart, canceling beloved traditions like Vacation Bible School, the WELCA summer barbeque and our Harvest Festival, and worshiping without a choir, just to name a few. We faced some overwhelming challenges and there were plenty of times when I wondered how we would navigate all the uncertainty. I worried more about what we *wouldn't* be able to do instead of focusing on what God *could* (and ultimately did) accomplish through this amazing congregation.

Yes, we may have been separated for large parts of 2020, but COVID-19 did not stop us from being **church together**. The Spirit moved us to faithfully adapt and by the grace of God, we did! No, it wasn't easy and we all had to make some personal sacrifices along the way for the safety and well-being of everyone in our congregation. However, the love of Christ carried us through and we came out of 2020 stronger than when we started it. God is good all the time and all the time God is good!

I want to thank Joe Bahadur who provided us with his Webex account and hosted all our virtual services for those first few months. Without his help, we probably would have missed more than just that one Sunday in March. I certainly didn't know how to livestream anything, much less an entire worship service from our sanctuary, but Joe stepped up and thanks to him we were able to have our first remote service on March 22, 2020. We quickly added video to our services with the purchase of a webcam and started doing "Virtual Vespers" on Thursday nights. A big thank you to Richard Dietrich, Dan Gonzalez and Bruce Feltkamp who assisted me in getting the sanctuary wired for internet access. I could not have done that without their knowledge and help! We eventually purchased better webcams (wide angle, 1080p, etc.) and added a second camera view from the balcony. Special computer speakers were also purchased so that those gathered in the sanctuary could hear anyone worshiping via Zoom.

We resumed in-person gatherings over the summer with a few outdoor services on our front lawn before finally reopening our church building in August. We followed all the local and state guidelines with wearing masks, social distancing (taping off pews), and using "contactless" measures like digital bulletins and self-serve communion cups. We also purchased the necessary safety equipment like thermometers, hand sanitizing stations, additional masks etc.

With the building primarily vacant and nobody coming in during the week, there were some extra duties that I took on in 2020 including lawn care, snow removal, updating our church sign, watering indoor plants, and even changing the light bulbs in the illuminated cross. I helped out at the New LIFE Center on some Thursday mornings, especially when they desperately needed volunteers. I also assisted Gabrielle Barry with virtual Sunday School classes, and I want to thank her for being the awesome teacher that she truly is! Gabrielle does a wonderful job with our Sunday School children and we are very blessed to have her at SJILC.

Another first in 2020 was the Thanksgiving piano concert performed by our church organist, Judy Markson, and her husband, Oliver Markson. The concert was absolutely marvelous, and having Judy play the piano made our Sunday morning worship services that much better. We hope to have more concerts from Judy and Oliver and possibly some other musicians in the future.

Many thanks to our fantastic church secretary, Andrea Sommella, who went above and beyond sending out emails, bulletins, messengers, making phone calls, and so forth. She is such a gift to our congregation in more ways than we can count. Thank you also to our council members for their leadership through this difficult time. The council had to make some really tough decisions and words cannot express how grateful I am for their input and support.

2020 not only reminded us of what is most important in our lives, but also the true meaning of church. Even though we couldn't be physically together for half the year, we continued to worship together, pray for one another, and share the love of God with our neighbor in need. We put our trust in God and in each other. To quote a song I learned in Sunday School: "The church is not a building; the church is not a steeple; the church is not a resting place; the church is a people. I am the church! YOU are the church! WE are the church together! All who follow Jesus, all around the world. Yes, we're the church together!"






We are continuing throughout winter, to collect coats and jackets for the **United Veterans Beacon**House's Annual Coat Drive.
