CELEBRATING 5 YEARS OF MINISTRY!

On Sunday, August 5th at the 9:30 am service, Don Roth gave the following speech in honor of Pastor Alex's 5-year anniversary as pastor of St. John's (now St. John-Incarnation) Lutheran Church:

PASTOR'S SPEECH

When I was approached by a member of the church council and asked if I would say a few KIND words about Pastor Alex I accepted the opportunity but had to give it a great deal of thought. This grown man is a Philadelphia Phillies and Philadelphia Eagles fan therefore how can I say any KIND words about him?

I decided to take a different approach to honor him today.

Knowing that Pastor is a big admirer of singing I thought I would honor him with some Beatles songs during my presentation. I ask you all to pay close attention and see if you can pick out the Beatles song as I deliver my talk.

It seems like only YESTERDAY that St John's was searching for a new shepherd to lead this flock. As a member of the call committee my job was to question our candidates on sermons and what their approach would be when delivering a sermon. We weren't looking for a pastor who would merely yada-yada-yada or OB LA DI OB LA DA throughout the entire sermon but one who would deliver a clear message.

After meeting as a committee on 1-2 evenings we all thought that this would be a LONG AND WINDING ROAD to select the best candidate. Little did we know that after the first interview session that this was not A HARD DAYS NIGHT but a rather easy decision.

The committee traveled to the RVC Lutheran church to hear our candidate deliver a sermon. It was perfect as he used every speech trick in the book to make it a pleasant experience. He opens his sermons with an "attention getter" using a short story or a cute joke. Once he gets our attention he gets to the heart of the message. When he feels that he may have lost the congregation he uses trick #2 which is the "delay and ask a question" tactic. "How many people have seen Gone with the Wind"? Well, 90% of us have so once again he has our attention. As he concludes his sermon it is often finished with a song. I am sure if we held church services every day Pastor

Alex would deliver a great sermon EIGHT DAYS A WEEK. Personally, I am glad Pastor Alex is not into RAP as I would hate to hear The Old Rugged Cross sung to a RAP beat. I CAN'T GET NO SATISFACTION from RAP music. (I just had to get a Rolling Stones song in here someplace!)

Pastor Alex your enthusiasm and encouragement has revitalized the Sunday School program along with our dedicated teachers, starting the Vacation Bible School has reached out to the youth in this congregation as well as in the community, your encouragement to ask for food for the food pantry, school supplies and for coats for the seafarers has made us all COME TOGETHER as a congregation.

At the end of each church service you greet everyone at the door with a firm handshake and positive words for the coming week. Whether it be Tom, Dick, or Harry or MICHELLE, ELEANOR RIGBY or even LADY MADONNA each person feels upbeat when leaving church. If anyone asks for HELP you are there to guide that person.

When you speak of your vegetable garden and your crops we all hope that you will have STRAWBERRY FIELDS FOREVER.

I can conclude by merely say God Bless You but I will instead use the two words you love to hear...GO EAGLES.

St. John-Incarnation Lutheran Church Roof Fund Appeal

The Stewardship and Finance committee is officially starting an appeal to replace the roof above the old church which is above the knotty pine room, church office, council room and nursery. We expect that the roof will cost at least \$20,000.00. We have been awarded a Congregational Capital Improvement Challenge Grant from the Metropolitan New York Synod Council for \$9,000. In order to receive this grant, St. John–Incarnation must first raise \$9,000 as matching funds. We have \$5,000 left over from the air conditioner fund which we will transfer to the roof fund. We also have a very generous offer from someone who is willing to match dollar-for-dollar every donation that is made to our roof fund. This means we only need to raise about 25% of the total amount from our members and friends of St. John-Incarnation! Thanks be to God!

It is our hope and prayer that you will consider making a donation to the new roof.

Donations can be made in "Memory of" or in "Honor of" anyone you wish to be remembered or honored.

Donations will be shared each month in our Messenger.
