A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ALEX...

Oh how I hoped beyond hope that we would be able to gather for worship in our sanctuary this Christmas Eve! After everything we have endured these past 10 months, I wanted nothing more than to have a "normal" celebration of our Lord's birth with all of you, and frankly, the notion of going back to fully remote services was one I didn't even want to think about, much less consider! Whether it was optimism or denial (I think it was a little bit of both!), I was certain that we would somehow figure out a way to be physically together on Christmas Eve.

Unfortunately, however, with COVID numbers quickly rising again in our community and around the world (not to mention that we are now in the dreaded "flu season"), I recognize that we are no longer able to safely worship in-person even with masks and social—distancing. Therefore, we are suspending all in-person services at St. John-Incarnation Lutheran Church from now until at least the end of January. All worship services will be held on Zoom only during this time. This decision follows a recommendation made by our Bishop and the Synod office to all the Lutheran congregations in the Metro NY Synod (including our neighboring churches here in the SW Nassau Conference) that "all our members celebrate this holy season online, and that all in-person worship be suspended until the end of January 2021, at which point we will reassess the situation."

Please know that this was not an easy decision. It required *a lot* of prayer, and there were definitely some tears and sleepless nights as I wrestled with our options. However, I do firmly believe that this is the right call for our congregation. I know it's not what any of us wanted or hoped for, but I love you all too much to put you at risk, and as your pastor there is nothing more important to me than your safety and well-being.

Will this keep us from worshiping on Christmas Eve and in the weeks ahead? Absolutely not! Our celebration of Christ's birth will go on, my dear friends, and through the gift of Zoom we will be able to worship and praise God together from our homes (this will also allow us to sing, which we **would not** have been able to do if we were gathering in-person!). So here's the plan: We will have **two** virtual services on Christmas Eve – a family service with a special children's message at **3:00pm** and our regular service at **7:30pm**. Both services will include music (the hymns will be different) and each should run no longer than an hour. We **will** be singing "Silent Night" at the 7:30pm service so make sure you have a candle ready to light if possible! On Sunday, December 27 we will have our annual service of Lessons and Carols at 9:30am via Zoom and on Thursday, January 7th we will resume our Thursday night services with a "Virtual Vespers" at 7:30pm.

We will make every effort to deliver the best video and audio quality that we can for these services, but in order to do this we will need your help. It's wonderful that we can worship live in real-time, but the downside of this format is that any background/ambient noise interferes with the audio of our worship. Zoom can only handle one audio source at a time so if other devices (i.e. your phones, computers, tablets, etc.) are not muted, the sound will cut in and out. Our Zoom hosts can mute people individually, but that's a difficult task when we have lots of people on Zoom and some insist on being un-muted. This needs to be a collective effort; otherwise, people won't be able to hear and then we may have to consider pre-recorded services, which we want to avoid if we can.

Please note that there will be no distribution of Holy Communion in worship until we resume in-person services. That being said, I will be available for 1-on-1 meetings including prayer, Communion, and spiritual care. If you need to speak with me or you have a pastoral emergency, you can reach me directly at 484-400-4777. You may also schedule a time to come to the church and see our Memorial Garden at night, which we have decorated with Christmas lights. It's a wonderful place to spend some time in prayer or you can even bring your children to see the lights and hear the bells if you're looking for a reason to get out the house \odot

May God bless us and help us to open our hearts in love as we prepare for the coming of the One who is "the reason for the season." Trusting in that good news of great joy for all of God's people, we will join our voices as together we sing, "Joy to the world! The Lord is come!"
