PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Outdoor Sign Update

It's been a while since we have talked about the outdoor sign that was initially proposed at the January 2009 annual meeting. At that time, we talked about the need for a bigger, more visible outdoor sign to help us to communicate with our community about what is going on at St. John's. A sign will help us to invite our neighbors to be a part of what God is doing through our congregation.

At the annual meeting in 2009, we voted as a congregation to purchase a sign once the money needed for this project had been raised. The motion we approved capped the price of the sign (materials, labor, permits, etc.) at \$11,000. We communicated this to our members, and asked people to consider making a donation to the sign fund as they felt moved, although we never initiated a formal, official campaign to raise the money.

We have great news! The sign fund has now been fully funded! People have been donating money earmarked specifically for the sign over the past 2+ years. Thanks to the generosity of several people, we now have the \$11,000 that will enable us to purchase the sign. When completed, it will be installed in the "triangle", where it will be visible from the intersection of Merrick Road and Peninsula Boulevard. Thanks be to God for the ways people have responded to the inspiration of the Holy Spirit!

There has been some conversation and discussion about whether or not we should spend money for a sign when our congregation has other needs (such as a new roof for the parsonage in the near future). The Congregational Council has discussed this concern, and "gets" this line of thinking. We know that there is some anxiety about the financial situation of the church and a desire to be prudent in our spending. However, members of our church designated donations specifically to the sign fund, and we honor those designations. Just as important, we believe that God never calls us to a spirit of fear. God is always doing a new thing, and in fact often calls us to move beyond what seems "safe" to something that is just outside our comfort zone. The members and leaders of our church have often expressed a desire for St. John's to grow in its mission, ministries, and membership, and if that is to happen, we need to step out and try some new things.

A new sign is just one of those things. We recognize that ultimately it is just one tool, much as the website and newsletter are tools. The *most* effective way for us to reach out to our neighbors is through each one of you – talking to your friends, your co-workers, and your family. It happens when we start to notice the many ways God is at work in our lives and in our church and get bold enough to share those stories! But while we continue to work on ways for us "shy" Lutherans to get more comfortable doing that, the sign is yet one more way to share the news of what God is doing through us here at St. John's.

We have begun to work on the preliminary steps towards installing the sign, which includes having the property surveyed and getting permits from the village. Please look for more news about the progress of the sign as we go forward. And please, if you have concerns or questions about the sign, the process, the decision, bring them to any member of the Council or to Pr. Becky. Your feedback and opinions are important to us, and we value the opportunity to talk together.
