† PASTOR'S MESSAGE



We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labor pains until now; and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies.

~Romans 8:22-23

As we look around the world in recent days, God's whole creation certainly seems to be groaning. There have been devastating floods as far away as Pakistan and Australia and as close to home as New Jersey. There have been catastrophic earthquakes in New Zealand and Japan. The earthquake in Japan led to the horrific damage of the tsunami that followed and concerns for the nuclear reactors in its path. For all of the places with too much water, there are other parts of the planet suffering from drought. God's creation groans under the weight of human over-consumption and neglect - habitats and consequently species are disappearing, there are giant conglomerations of plastic and other trash that float together in our oceans, glaciers are melting at an alarming speed.

Truly, it is not just the creation that groans as we wait for God's redemption. We groan as we face our own fears and anxieties - about our health, about our finances, about our families, and all of the problems and pitfalls that daily

confront us. Perhaps some of us can relate to Billy Crystal's character in When Harry Met Sally, who, when asked what he will do if he can't sleep, replies that he'll just practice moaning. Sometimes we may feel that that's all we can do.

As people of faith though, we know that moaning and groaning is not all that we can do. It is not all we have to look forward to. We have the promise of scripture to remind us that God has not given up on God's creation, which includes us as well as the planet and environment (in fact, the whole universe!). The book of Revelation says, "'Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth; for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away... And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "See, the home of God is among mortals. He will dwell with them; they will be his peoples, and God himself will be with them; he will wipe every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more; mourning and crying and pain will be no more, for the first things have passed away.' And the one who was seated on the throne said, 'See, I am making all things new." (21:1, 3-5)

God's promise in scripture is the promise of Easter. It is the promise that even though things may sometimes seem hopeless, death and mourning and crying and pain will not have the last word. Groaning is not the end of the story. In Christ, God is making all things new. In Christ, we have the final victory, because we know that Christ has died, Christ is risen, and Christ will come again. These are not just meaningless words we say in church - they are the very truth of God given to us to fill us with hope, to give us courage in the face of the things that make us groan.

As we continue to travel through the season of Lent, we hold on to the promise of Easter. We wait with hope and with faith, and we wait actively - looking for the ways that we can partner with God in making all things new, in easing the groaning of each other and of all creation, trusting in the power of God to renew and restore us as we do.

Looking forward to God's new creation with you!

SUMMER 2011 LOOKING FOR CAMP OPTIONS?

The Metro New York Synod has three different camp opportunities for kids of all ages! Spending time at a Lutheran summer camp has a tremendous impact on the faith development of our young people, so why not consider sending your child to a Lutheran camp this year?

Koinonia - Located in Highland Lake, NY, Koinonia has youth camp for children from 2nd grade through high school. They also have family camp. Check them out on the web at www.koinoniany.org

Camp Ma-He-Tu - This camp is "Just For Girls. Just For Fun." It's a girls-only sleepaway camp for girls ages 7 through 15. They are located at Bear Mountain, NY, & have different themes for each camping period. Pinecrest Lutheran Leadership School - This camp is for older youth (ages 15 & up), and meets for one week each August (Aug. 14-21 this year). Camp is held at Camp Louemma in Sussex, NJ, and includes lots of opportunities for youth and young adults to explore their Lutheran faith and what it means to be a leader in the church as they grow up. UPDATE ON FAMILY PROMISE PROGRAM

Some of you have asked what the status of the Family Promise program at St. John's is. To refresh your memory, Family Promise is the interfaith initiative that helps homeless families by housing them overnight in different houses of worship for a week at a time. At the same time, Family Promise also provides families the services needed for them to get & maintain permanent housing.

St. John's had been exploring the option of becoming a host site that would have guests sleep in the church building one week at a time about four times a year. However, we were not able to find a Coordinator to organize and facilitate our volunteers.

In the meantime. Oceanside Lutheran Church, which has been involved with Family Promise from the beginning, suggested that the Lutheran churches in the Southwest Nassau Conference join forces and become a network together. Oceanside will be the host site, and St. John's has agreed to be a support congregation. This means that for one or two nights during the assigned weeks, St. John's folks will serve as volunteers, helping to prepare and serve meals, socialize with the guests, play games, help with homework, spend the night at Oceanside's building, and so on. (Many different people will fill these slots, so don't get thrown by that long list!) Other local Lutheran churches will also supply volunteers to fill the other nights.

This is a great way for us to get our feet wet and learn what the program is about and how it runs. We'd still love to have a person or two who can coordinate our volunteers, but it will be a less work-intensive role. And we still hope to become a host site someday if God leads us to do so.

Family Promise is currently seeking a new director, so they are not hosting any families at the moment. Please continue to look for updates, and/or let Pr. Becky know if you are interested in volunteering so we can put you on our list of people to call when the network is up and running. Thanks!
