At this time of the year, I often think of a line from the movie, *Forrest Gump*. On New Year's Eve in New York, one of the women who Forrest finds himself with says, "Don't ya just love New Year's? Everybody gets a chance to make a new start." I think that's why we celebrate the beginning of a new year. Whatever has gone before in the past year, when the new year dawns, we feel like we are getting a chance to start over. We look over what has happened in the past year, and we make resolutions about what we would like to do differently going forward.

Now, I'm not one who usually makes New Year's resolutions, because I know how easy they are to break.
