† PASTOR'S MESSAGE

I had plenty of experience with babies before I became a mother. I babysat newborns and older babies and toddlers in high school. I watched my sister's kids from time to time when I was visiting home. I've spent time with lots of friends who have kids. But it's a different thing when you are the one in charge (and I imagine many of you reading this nodding your heads and smiling at the naiveté of your pastor: "Of course it's different!") It's a strange new world to have someone who relies on you so completely for everything, to know that she needs you to feed her and change her and sing to her and rock her and play with her and take care of her needs all day every day. To do all of those things is to recognize how vulnerable she is on her own, how defenseless, and to realize how utterly dependent babies are on the adults in their lives.

This year, as a new mom coming to the season of Advent, looking forward to the celebration of Christmas, knowing what I am beginning to know about parenthood, I am astounded at the audacity, the boldness, the bravery of God. Audacious because God dared to send a helpless baby into the world and call him Savior of that world. Who can imagine a baby who can't

do anything for himself as the Savior of the world, yet that is what God says Jesus is. But bold and brave because God dares to send this babe, God's only begotten Son, into the world. God sends him into this often dark and dangerous world - and then God leaves him in someone else's care. God entrusts this one and only Son into the hands of human beings. Most moms and dads I know have a hard time leaving their baby with the babysitter or in day care just for a little while (at least initially). And here God sends Jesus to be raised and cared for by Mary and Joseph for life! I can't imagine doing it or how even God could do it.

But the Bible gives us the reason why God does it. It's right there in John 3:16 & 17. (Verse 17 is less well-known, but to my mind, it's just as important!)

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him."

For God so loved the world... and all I can say is that that is a mighty powerful love that could send the only Son to become flesh and dwell with us, to take on our vulnerabilities, to enter into our dependence so that we might learn Who we can depend on. God sends Jesus into the world as a human baby so that we might begin to understand how deep, how intense God's love is for us - and that we might be transformed and saved by that love.

Stir up your power, Lord Christ, and come. Help us to see God's love for us in your life, beginning to end. May we be amazed and changed by what you have done for us, and empowered to share that love with the world around us this Christmas and always.
