## A Message from Pastor Jeff Laustsen~

"Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away." - Luke 21:33.
The arrival of the last month of the year usually means that our thoughts turn to preparations for Christmas. We begin bringing our decorations out of the attic, string lights on our trees and houses, make our list of gifts and plan our trips to the mall or what websites we will visit to complete our shopping. In the church, December means the arrival of the season of Advent, with our wreaths and songs reminding us that it is time once again to "prepare the way of the Lord" as we await the coming of our Savior who will fulfill all of God's promises on our behalf.

But this year, the arrival of December also brings with it our continuing efforts to rebuild from the devastation caused by Hurricane Sandy. For many of our families, they will not be able to celebrate Christmas in their homes this year; it may be several months before their damaged homes will once again be habitable. For many other families, they will be celebrating Christmas with family and friends who are living with them, and managing to set extra places at the table and put extra presents under the tree. For all of us, the arrival of Advent and Christmas bring with it the fear, anxiety and uncertainty that we have lived with ever since this super storm devastated so many of our homes and communities.

The reality of living in the midst of rebuilding will make this Advent and Christmas unlike any we have ever experienced. But the message of these holy seasons will speak to us a word of hope and joy that are especially needed in this time of darkness and despair. The child born of Mary in that little town of Bethlehem was born so that "the hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight." The glad tidings of the angels that came upon that midnight clear was spoken to "you, beneath life's crushing load, whose forms are bending low, who toil along the climbing way with painful steps and slow," inviting all who are weary from the task of rebuilding their homes and their lives to "rest beside the weary road and hear the angels sing!" Amidst the fear and anxiety that have been the constant companion of so many of our lives since the storm comes the message the angels first spoke to the fear-filled shepherds:

- "Do not be afraid; for see - I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord." - Luke 2:10-11.

We prepare for these seasons in the midst of unimaginable loss, facing a future that may be far different from the manner in which we lived even a few months ago. But we also enter into these holy seasons with the confident hope that no matter what losses we may have suffered, the one constant reality for us is that the presence of God is always with us, that the birth of Jesus is our assurance that we live constantly in the presence of the one who was born to be Emmanuel - God with us. We may not celebrate Christmas in the same places or under the same circumstances, but we will celebrate this holy day in the presence of the one who is with us always, whose "light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it!" (John 1:5).

Mill Neck supplied St. John's with apples, apple cider, and apple butter. We did the selling and the profit was returned to Mill Neck Manor School.

When Mill Neck no longer participated, St. John's decided to continue the Harvest Festival each Fall selling not only apples and apple products but pumpkins, homemade cakes and pies, and our now famous Bric -A-Brac, giving pony rides and having a petting zoo for the children. We also have a special St. John's Harvest Festival Raffle with awesome prizes donated by some of our members and a very profitable 50/50 Raffle.

In keeping with the original purpose for the Harvest Festival, any profits we take in are donated to local charities. In the past few years we have supported Pinecrest Lutheran Camp, Run with the Owls in Lynbrook, The Barbara
