A Message from Pastor Jeff Laustsen~

"The grass withers, the flower fades; but the word of our God will stand forever." – Isaiah 40:8.

A few months ago, I took another step into 21st Century technology when I acquired a Kindle Fire, an e-reader that also has access to the internet. While I'm not getting rid of my traditional library (and I still buy books in which I write notes and highlight passages), it's been a nice way to read and purchase a wide assortment of books and magazines. I'm currently reading the latest novel by Dean Koontz and the third volume of the biography of Lyndon B. Johnson, and I've enjoyed being able to have many books contained in a fairly light electronic devise.

One of the volumes contained in my Kindle Fire is a copy of the New Revised Standard translation of the Bible, which is testimony to the ever-increasing access of Holy Scripture on these new electronic platforms. We are blessed to live in an age when people have the Word of God available to them in more formats and in more languages than at any other time in history. While there was once a time in the life of the church when only a certain few had the Word of God at their fingertips, today we can read and access the Holy Bible on our smart phones, tablets, computers, and even in more traditional printed form. No matter where you may be, you're never far away from the Word that remains "a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." (Psalm 119:105).

This universal availability of the Word of God is the latest chapter in the legacy we celebrate on Reformation Sunday: Martin Luther's translation of the Bible into the language of the people, so that all might hear the Word that proclaims the good news of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. As Lutherans around the world once gain celebrate our heritage with festive worship services and the joyous singing of such great hymns as "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God" and "Lord, Keep Us Steadfast in Your Word," we give thanks for Luther's bold initiative in placing the Word of God into our hands so that "in our own

languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." (Acts 2:11).

Many Lutheran congregations celebrate Reformation Sunday by giving Bibles to the children in their Sunday Schools. In obedience to the promises we make to our children on the day of their baptisms, they will place in their hands God's Word as we continue to provide for their instruction in the Christian faith, "so that your children may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace." (ELW Holy Baptism). As these children mature in an age when technological advances will continue to amaze us, they will have access to the life-changing Word of God in countless platforms, so that the good news of Jesus Christ might shine its light into every day of their lives.

But as with every version of God's Word – from Luther's German translation to the English Bible on my Kindle Fire – the Bible will bless us only when we open its pages and allow God's Word to transform. That's why it's especially important for Lutherans who celebrate our Reformation heritage as "people of the Word" to recommit themselves to regular reading of God's Word along with gathering for worship around the Word which we know is the "word of Eternal Life." No matter if it's the old family Bible on your bookshelf or the latest Bible app on you I-Phone, God's Word will bless us *only* when we turn to the Word, which will always bless us as people of God.

As we join with Lutherans around the world in celebrating the Reformation this month, may we commit ourselves to remain steadfast in the Word of God in whatever means it comes to us, living in obedience to the promise of our Lord that "if you continue in my Word, you are truly my disciples; and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free." (John 8:31-32).
