Sunday School Moving UP Day

A Message from Pastor Jeff Laustsen ~

"You have made public profession of your faith. Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism ..." – Affirmation of Baptism Service, Evangelical Lutheran Worship.

In many Lutheran congregations, this is the time of year in which we celebrate Confirmation with our young people and their families. It is the culmination of years of classes, of studying the Bible and the *Small Catechism*, filling out worship notes and serving as acolytes. It is the day in which our young people process into worship in white robes while their families and friends look on with pride as they kneel before the altar and confirm their faith as they "ask God to help and guide me." In the presence of the congregation that has nurtured them in the faith, they receive the laying on of hands as the pastor prays to our "Father in heaven, for Jesus' sake, [to] stir up the gift of your Holy Spirit." As many congregations celebrate Confirmation on the day of Pentecost, we pray this gift of God's Spirit will "confirm their faith, guide their life, empower them in their serving, give them patience in suffering, and bring them to eternal life."

Growing up in a devoutly Lutheran family, I attended the Confirmation services of my cousins every year; and on June 6, 1971, it was my turn to kneel at the altar of my home congregation and be confirm my faith in the presence of my family and friends. I can't say that I remember much from that day (other than having a really bad haircut and receiving a prayer book that I still possess), but what I do cherish about my Confirmation is that no matter where I have been in these past 42 years – no matter how far I may have strayed from God or tried to live my life on my own terms – God has always been with me. I may not have understood exactly what I was "confirming" on that day, but I know that God was confirming his covenant that I first received when I was baptized on April 28, 1957: that I am God's child, that God's love for me is eternal, that nothing can separate me from the goodness of God's presence that is mine in Christ Jesus our Lord. While what I was confirming on that hot June afternoon was important, what was of greater importance was that God was confirming God's love for me, and that God has continued confirm that steadfast love throughout all the trials and challenges I have faced in the years since I wore my white Confirmation gown and celebrated that distinctively Lutheran rite of passage with the people of my home congregation.

As I prepare to preside at another Confirmation celebration as pastor of Holy Trinity, I approach the day with the same mixed feelings that are a part of every Confirmation service at which I have presided. While it is a time of celebration for our young people, their families, and the church, it is also a time in which my relationship with them as teaching is coming to an end. While I hope to remain in relationship with them, I know full well that I won't see many of these young people on a regular basis. I won't know what will become of them, or where the future will lead them. I hope that God will give us the opportunity to continue our relationship, but there are no guarantees that this will happen. I may be smiling in the class photos, but inside a piece of my heart is also breaking. But I do take comfort in the knowledge that no matter where these young people may go – even if it's far away from me and from this congregation, that God has confirmed God's love for each of them, that God will always be with them, and that "the one who began a good work in you will bring it to completion on the day of Jesus Christ." (Philippians 1:6). As we rejoice in the Confirmation of our sons and daughters, we give thanks to God who confirms that God's steadfast love will abide with them always, so that they can live in trust and hope that nothing will separate them from the love of God which is ours in Christ Jesus our Lord.

"Lord God of our ancestors, we thank you for what you have done and will continue to do with our daughters and sons. Walk with them in life, and keep the evil one from obstructing their path. You see all; you know where the water is deep. Keep them from danger. Order their steps and guide their feet while they run the race of faith. May the good work that you have begun in them be brought to completion at the day of Jesus Christ, in whose name we pray. Amen." (ELW).



LET'S START PLANNING FOR THE HARVEST FESTIVAL SUNDAY, OCTOBER 6TH 2013

If you are starting your Spring Cleaning remember the Harvest is October 6th this year. Think about donating some of your gently used items for our Bric – A – Brac table. The **when and where** to drop these items will be announced soon!

And....do not forget our new Scarecrow building table.

BUILD A SCARECROW

We are going to have the inaugural Build-a Scarecrow table at this years' Harvest Festival. Any one who comes to the table will have the opportunity to create their own custom made scarecrow (for a modest fee...~\$10- \$15 depending on material costs) to help bring in the fall season.

To make this possible, were looking for donations of the following items to use for the scarecrow creations:

- ▲ Long sleeve shirts (Flannels preferably for the authentic scarecrow look, adult or children sizes)
- A Pants...denim or carpenter pants or whatever you can spare. (again, adult or children sizes)
- Any wood or lumber that could be used to make the armatures for the scarecrows. Just need something in the shape of a cross to put in the sleeves and provide support for when the scarecrows are mounted in the ground.

The plan is to stuff the clothes with newspapers and hay, attach a head to the scarecrow, then attach it to an armature so the scarecrow can be planted" in your yard.

If you do have any of these items that you would be willing to donate, or if you come across any of these items at a garage sale, thrift store etc, please set them aside and contact me so I can get an idea of how many scarecrows well be able to accommodate. I'll be placing a bin in the Narthex for any donations. Here's to hoping that this will be a success!
