#### A Message from Pastor Jeff Laustsen ~ March 2013

"Good Friday and Easter free us to think about other things far beyond our own personal fate, about the ultimate meaning of all life, suffering, and events; and we lay hold of a great hope." - Dietrich Bonhoeffer, Easter 1943.

Among my fondest Easter memories are the annual sunrise services on the shores of Barnegat Bay in Waretown, New Jersey. During the years I served in that Jersey Shore community, Christians from all of the churches of the community would gather at the town docks at 6:30 a.m. to welcome the sunrise that heralded the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. While we would gather at our individual churches later that morning, our common worship was a wonderful testimony to what unites us as Christians: the good news that *"Jesus Christ is risen today"* and that as the rising sun defeats the darkness of night, the light of Christ *"shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it."* (John 1:5).

But there were years when the sun did not rise at the sunrise service on Easter morning; on many occasions, the weather was far from ideal, with the winds whipping across the waters of the bay and casting a chill on our worship gathering. But even when the sun was obscured by clouds, we had reason to rejoice; for the message of Easter is that even when it appears as though the light of Christ is being hidden from us, we have confidence that our Risen Lord is with us in all circumstances, for nothing *"will separate us from the love of God that is ours in Christ Jesus our Lord."* (Romans 8:39). Even when there was no sunrise at the sunrise service, there was the light of Christ that shines among us on sunny and cloudy days, in good times and bad times, in times of joy and times of sorrow. We were thrilled when we had a beautiful sunrise across the waters on Easter morning; but we celebrated the good news of the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ no matter what kind of weather welcomed us that morning, because the only light we needed was the light of our crucified and risen Savior.

When Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrote the above words to his parents on Easter Day in 1943, he wrote from a place of unspeakable darkness: the Nazi prison in Tegel, Germany, where he was incarcerated for his participation in a plot to kill Adolf Hitler. Bonhoeffer would never again experience feeling the sunlight of freedom; he was executed on April 9, 1945 at the age of 39, shortly before the end of the war. But even in the darkness and despair of that prison, Bonhoeffer is still able to *"lay hold of a great hope,"* knowing that even that fortress erected but such an evil empire could not separate him from the light of Christ and the presence of our Risen Lord. He knew that the Easter Gospel gave him the hope to *"think about other things far beyond our own personal fate,"* because no matter what the Nazis would do to him, because our Savior lives we shall live also, because *"if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his."* (Romans 6:5).

It's far too early to tell what kind of weather we will have on Easter morning this year; March Easters can be beautiful and sunny, or cloudy and chilly. But no matter what kind of weather greets us as we awake on Easter morning, the message of this Easter will always be the same: our Lord Jesus Christ is risen from the dead, and because he lives we shall live also! His light shines before us always, and no darkness will ever overcome it! Every day – no matter how dark or despair-filled it may be – we can live in trust and hope, because *Christ the Lord is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!*
