A Message from Pastor Alex ~

"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

With these words from Genesis 3:19, we usher in the Lenten season as we remember who we really are in the Ash Wednesday liturgy. The ashes that we receive on our foreheads each year remind us of our true nature as human beings. We humbly acknowledge that we are dust. We are mindful of our mortality, that our time here on this earth is but a blink of an eye. This reality reminds us that each day is truly a blessing, given to us by a loving and generous God.

The season of Lent is a time for reflection and repentance. We confess that we are sinners who are in perpetual need of mercy and forgiveness. But in that brokenness and despair, we turn our hearts toward Jerusalem and set our sights on the Cross of Calvary, that tree of life which upon our savior freely died for you and for me.

Thus, it's really not surprising that we traditionally think of this season as a journey. For many years the Church has used this image as a way of framing these 40 days that await us. And while I think this is a good metaphor in a spiritual sense in that it gives us some direction and helps guide us from Ash Wednesday to Easter, it's important to remember that in the end, this is not *our* journey. After all, we don't physically go anywhere! No, this is Christ's journey - a journey from sin to redemption, from darkness to light, from death and the grave to life and salvation. Our Lord simply calls us to follow Him on that journey that we may behold that throne of grace that awaits us all.

Looking forward to worshipping & praying with you this Lenten season.


