#### RETURNING TO WORSHIP AT SJILC – PLEASE READ!

Dear Members and Friends of SJILC,

After nearly four months of worshiping virtually, we plan to have our first outdoor service this Sunday, July 12 at 9:30am! Please read the following if you plan to join us:

We will gather out on the front lawn with people sitting 6 feet apart and practicing social distancing. Families will be asked to sit together and separate themselves from other individuals and families. Face coverings/masks will be required throughout the service and hand sanitizer will be available for anyone who needs it.

Please bring your own lawn chair and a copy of the bulletin. You can print the bulletin ahead of time or view it on an electronic device. We will have a few chairs on hand for those who need one, however no copies of the bulletin will be distributed.

There will be NO physical sharing of the Peace. Offering will be collected in a plastic offering bin located on the same table with hand sanitizer, face masks, etc.

COMMUNION - Communion is pre-packaged in individual cups with grape juice and a wafer. After the Words of Institution and Lord's Prayer, Pastor Alex will bring communion to where you are seated. **A face covering or mask is required to receive communion.** Those not taking communion (children or adults) are welcome to receive a blessing. (*Folding your arms over your chest will indicate that you wish to receive a blessing.*)

There will be no greeting with Pastor Alex following the service to allow easy exit without lines forming.

We recommend you bring a bottle of water to stay hydrated and keep cool. The Ushers (wearing gloves) will be giving out hand fans to those who need them.

We will continue to offer our worship services on Zoom for those who wish to stay home and/or are unable to come to church. You could also park on Merrick Road or in the village lot across the street and watch/listen from your car! An officer will be present to help with crossings.

In the event of inclement weather, the service will take place on Zoom.

#### A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ALEX...

## "When I am afraid, I put my trust in you. In God, whose word I praise, in God I trust; I shall not be afraid." – Psalm 56:3-4a

We all know what it feels like to be afraid. Fear, worry, and anxiety accompany us throughout our entire lives. Some of us have specific phobias like the fear of heights, spiders, germs or even being scared of the dark (mine is definitely snakes – even a garter makes me squirm and run the other direction!) Others experience social anxiety and avoid public places all the time, not just during a pandemic. Then there are the fears that we all have whether we like to admit them or not – fear of failure, fear of change, fear of rejection and commitment, fear of being alone, fear of not having enough, fear of the future. We fear others who are different than us. We fear uncertainty and that which is out of our control.

Unfortunately, our hearts have been even more troubled these past few months as the coronavirus has brought us a whole new set of fears and uncertainties: How contagious is the virus? What happens if I or someone I love gets it? What if it takes another year for a vaccine to be developed? How will we deal with a second wave? Can our congregation endure? Will we ever overcome this?

No, we are certainly no strangers to fear. Worrying and being afraid are as common as the rising and setting of the sun. Fear is also very powerful! A "healthy fear" (in moderation) can keep us from harm and even move us to change. On the other hand, too much fear can quickly wear us down – holding us back from sharing God's love and living into the new life that Jesus freely gives us. In the words of Maxie Dunnam, this kind of fear "penetrates the heart, poisons the spirit, and paralyzes the soul."

The Bible, of course, is filled with stories and passages about fear. We read in the gospels that the disciples were often afraid throughout Jesus' ministry, and even Jesus himself, being fully human, experienced fear when he was on the cross: "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?. And yet, our good Lord comforts the disciples and us when he says, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." (John 14:27) Can we live by faith and not by fear? I would like to invite you to join us for a 4 week summer Bible study series that will explore this theme of **Faith and Fear**. We will "meet" on Wednesday evenings at 7:30pm via Zoom beginning on July 22 and concluding on August 12. The focus for these four weeks will be as follows:

Week 1 (July 22): "Original Fear" – why do we worry and fear? What causes us to be afraid?

Week 2 (July 29): The Fear of the Lord – fearing God vs. being afraid of God

Week 3 (Aug. 5): Psalms about Faith & Fear – "Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me." (Ps. 23:4)

Week 4 (Aug. 12): Fear Not! Do Not be Afraid – Jesus says, "Do not be afraid, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom."

Please join us! Invite your family and friends! The more voices and perspectives we can have, the better!

In addition to the Bible study, our Evening Prayer services will continue on Thursday evenings at 7:30pm via Zoom. We will also continue to broadcast our Sunday worship on Zoom for those who cannot attend our outdoor services beginning on Sunday, July 12.

As we look forward to reopening and reuniting, may we put our trust in God to watch over us and help us live in the light of Christ. To quote a familiar hymn, "Fear not, I am with you, oh, be not dismayed, for I am your God and will still give you aid; I'll strengthen you, help you, and cause you to stand, upheld by my righteous omnipotent hand." (*How Firm a Foundation*, vs. 2)



It's simple. You can drop off your items Monday through Thursday from 8:00am – 4:00pm (Friday until 2:00pm) in the blue bins behind the 837 building (**NOT BY THE AWNING**) on our Bethpage campus at 837 S. Oyster Bay Rd. Bethpage, NY 11714.

Just call them when you arrive (516-822-2099) and they will come out with a receipt for you. **Tell them you are from SJILC!** Please make sure your items are tightly sealed in a plastic bag before arriving and placing in the bins.

RewearAble is a program where your donations help to create jobs for adults with learning and developmental disabilities.

Many people with developmental disabilities have a life objective to work, and RewearAble is able to employ them in an integrated work force and pay them minimum wage or higher. **ACLD** is a leading Long Island based not-for-profit agency devoted to supporting the pursuit of an enviable life for children and adults with autism, learning and other developmental disabilities.

This innovative program was created for the express purpose of employing disabled adults who could not work in a competitive environment.

RewearAble collects clothing of all types, sizes and condition, and shoes. The in-house sorting process ensures everything they collect is prepared for reuse or repurposing.

Additionally, RewearAble also helps the environment by keeping unwanted clothing and fabric material out of landfills.

# Lynbrook schools host drive-by graduations

Marion Street, Waverly Park and West End elementary schools in Lynbrook hosted three drive-through graduations on June 15, in honor of graduating fifth grade students.

Superintendent of Schools Melissa Burak, school principals, faculty, staff and board members joined together to support and congratulate the graduates.

At Marion Street, staff members lined the sidewalk outside the school, holding banners and signs to cheer on the graduates as they drove by with their families. Cars were decorated with balloons, colorful signs, window paint and more to mark the occasion.

At the end of the street, Principal Theresa Macchia announced each graduate's name as they pulled up in their cars, and she then handed them a graduation goodie bag and congratulated them.

Waverly Park Principal Allison Banhazl, staff members and fifth grade teachers gathered for their ceremony in the circle in front of their school. Banhazl announced each graduate, as they drove by in their decorated cars while staff cheered them on. Fifth grade teachers gifted each graduate with a goodie bag and certificate. Students also posed for a photo in a large cardboard class of 2020 picture frame.

At West End, graduates drove through a white and red balloon arch at the entrance of the school parking lot, where fifth grade teachers wearing matching outfits and graduation sashes greeted them. Names of graduates and special awards were announced and each student received a gift from their teacher and the PTA. Then, a DJ played music, as staff members and dozens of Lynbrook North Middle School students held signs and cheered on the class of 2020.


