

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ALEX...

Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. – 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

Rejoice always. Pray continually. In all things give thanks. *This*, St. Paul declares, is what God wants for us in Christ Jesus. And yet, as we prepare for another Thanksgiving and reflect on this special holiday when we give thanks to God for all the blessings in our lives (when I was a kid it was the four Fs – faith, family, food and of course, football!), Paul’s encouraging words of wisdom to the Thessalonians may be tough for us to hear, much less embrace with everything we’ve been through together (and apart) this past year. Despite the countless jokes and memes about 2020 that will surely continue until well after January 31st, we know that this has been quite a difficult year, one unlike any we have ever experienced, and unfortunately it looks like COVID-19 will even affect our even holiday plans as well. And we’re supposed to *rejoice* in the midst of all this!? We might be able to pray without ceasing or at least give it our best try, but rejoicing and giving thanks!? In *these* circumstances!?

Absolutely!!! Paul never ceased in giving thanks for the Christians in the church at Thessalonica (“We always give thanks to God for all of you and mention you in our prayers” – 1 Thessalonians 1:2), and as we see throughout his epistles in the New Testament, he clearly preached what he practiced:

“Be filled with the Spirit, as you sing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs among yourselves, singing and making music to the Lord in your hearts, **giving thanks** to God the Father at all times and for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.” – Ephesians 5:18b–20

“Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and supplication with **thanksgiving**, let your requests be made known to God.” – Philippians 4:6

“Be thankful... And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, **giving thanks** to God the Father through him.” – Colossians 3:15b, 17

Paul wasn’t naive. He knew the circumstances at hand, and he was fully aware of the resistance and persecution that the early Christians faced. After all, he himself was a persecutor of believers before his conversion, and later on he would be imprisoned multiple times for his faith! Nevertheless, Paul remained confident of the hope we share in Christ, and as Christians have continued to endure hardships throughout the centuries, the apostle’s unwavering call to thanksgiving has remained.

So yes, we can rejoice and give thanks in a year like 2020 (our “grateful pumpkins” are proof of this!) and we can give *thankfully* too! Reassuring us of God’s abundant goodness, Paul reminds us in his second letter to the Corinthians that because the Lord has blessed us with enough, we may share freely, abundantly and gratefully: “You will be enriched in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion, and through us your generosity will result in thanksgiving to God.” (2 Corinthians 9:11–12)

As we look toward Thanksgiving and the start of Advent, we will reflect on this theme of “Grateful Giving” for our annual stewardship appeal which will not only help us plan our shared ministry here at St. John–Incarnation for 2021 and beyond, but also prepare our hearts and minds for Christ’s coming at Christmas. Until then, let us continue to give thanks and proclaim the good news of God’s love in Christ! Let us praise God’s name in all that we say and do, that God may be glorified through us and our giving together. To quote the psalmist, “Praise the Lord! Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his steadfast love endures forever.” (Psalm 106:1)

If you would like to donate flowers in honor or memory of someone for one of our worship services, please mail your donation to the church office with the date and names. Suggested donation is \$30.




LIGHTING THE ADVENT WREATH



Stay home and knit

About 400,000 seafarers have been stuck on sea on extended contracts with no shore leave due to COVID-19 related travel restrictions. They are the “invisible essential workers” and are overworked, frustrated and lonely. This is why we invite you, your business, school group or congregation to bring joy to seafarers who will not be home with their loved ones for Christmas. Through gangway hand-ups, our port chaplains safely deliver the satchels filled with gifts to the ships for the holiday. Every crew member on a ship regardless of their faith or nationality will open their satchels, each containing:

- One Sweatshirt – hooded or unhooded (size M-L-XL)
- Three Pairs of Socks – thermal or gym
- One T- Shirt (size M-L-XL)
- One Knitted Winter Cap (coordinating scarf optional; no pastels please),
- One Can of Nuts, Large Bar of Chocolate, or Healthy Snack Bar
- A Holiday or Christmas card from YOU!

You pick the colors, styles and brands, but please no substitutions from the list. For the safety of seafarers, please do not add fringes or pom-poms. The Christmas-at-Sea satchels should be comparable for each member of the crew.

And, please assemble each satchel with sweatshirts and T-shirts of the same size and label the satchel with a M, L, or XL on the back side.

Sunday, November 29th.**

Satchels are in the narthex. If you prefer to make a monetary donation, please leave the money in offering plate or drop it off at the church office. Andrea will send the money to the Seafarers International house.
