A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ALEX

As I write this message, my favorite basketball team the Philadelphia 76ers are finishing up a very competitive playoff series with the Atlanta Hawks, the winner of which could end up playing the Brooklyn Nets in the Eastern Conference Finals of the NBA playoffs. That is, of course, if the Nets are able to overcome all of their injuries and defeat the Milwaukee Bucks who are an immensely talented team in their own right. Only time will tell!

Meanwhile, Long Island's beloved hockey team, the New York Islanders, are facing off against the Tampa Bay Lightning in the semifinals of the NHL Stanley Cup Playoffs – the same team that eliminated the Isles from the postseason last year. The Lightning are a formidable opponent, to be sure, especially given the recent history between these two teams, but if the Isles can pull it off and beat the Lightning, they will have a chance to play for their first Stanley Cup since 1983 (which, coincidentally, was the very same year that my 76ers last won an NBA championship!)

Now I wasn't alive in 1983 and there may be some Islanders fans reading this who weren't either! But even if you were, that's still almost *40 years ago*, and as scripture reminds us when it comes to the number 40, whether it be days or years, we know there is going to be a great deal of waiting, testing, and hardship!

So needless to say, it's an exciting time for our sports teams, and since the Flyers aren't involved this year on the hockey side, I'm definitely rooting for the Islanders! I would love to see both the Sixers and Islanders win their respective championships because, bragging rights aside, I know how much joy (and relief!) it would bring to all the people young and old who have supported them throughout the season. When the Phillies won the World Series back in 2008 and the Eagles finally won the Super Bowl in 2018, I was fortunate enough to attend both parades in Philadelphia, and the pure elation that I witnessed was something I'll never forget. People cheering from windows and throwing out confetti. Complete strangers hugging and high-fiving one another. Teary-eyed fathers with their little ones sitting on their shoulders. Everyone was there for the same reason, and for those couple of hours we all put our differences aside and simply enjoyed the moment together.

But here's the thing: unfortunately, the parade and celebration come to an end. Yes, championships are wonderful when your team is the one hoisting that trophy, and I don't think anyone will disagree that winning is more fun than losing, but eventually another season begins and it's time to start again! So as much as you might want to keep basking in the glow of that victory, the reality is that everyone else has moved on and are ready to play.

And that's the best case scenario! Don't get me wrong, winning it all is an incredible experience and as a fan you'll always be able to reminisce and rewatch those special moments, but it doesn't last forever and it certainly isn't easy either! There's only one champion at the end of every season and unless you have a player like Michael Jordan or Tom Brady, in all likelihood your team will end up losing that last game or not making the playoffs and you'll be left feeling disappointed. It's very frustrating when you devote all that time and energy rooting on your favorite team only for them to let you down in the end. It's even more infuriating when that loss is due to injuries, bad coaching, questionable calls and/or a lack of effort, and you know that your team should have won! You may even feel some anger and hatred toward the other team depending on *who* it is and *how* they won the game.

Philly fans are quite notorious for this. We don't handle losing very well and whenever it happens no one is spared from our wrath. As Bob Uecker once famously said: "You know what they do when the game's rained out? They go to the airport and boo bad landings."

This leads to another problem. You'll notice that I included myself with Philadelphia sports fans by using the word "we". I'm well aware of the fact that *my* teams aren't the same as *your* teams, and while you and I can respectfully disagree about who's better or best, we know that ultimately it's all in good fun. Unfortunately, however, some fans take things a little too far, and this "us vs. them" or "us against the world" mentality leads to bigger issues.

Now I'm not saying that team sports are bad; not at all! I absolutely loved playing little league baseball and basketball when I was growing up and those experiences taught me the value of teamwork, practice, and good sportsmanship. I also loved having my family there to cheer me on and going to my siblings' games to do the same for them! No, the issue I'm referring to here is when sports move into the realm of idolatry. Feeling compelled to pick sides and defend their team at all costs, it's not surprising that hostility arises among fans and even entire cities! Should we be shocked when people take pleasure in seeing another team lose and their best players fail? (I know I've been guilty of this, especially when it comes to my Eagles!) But that's what happens when it's all about winning and nothing else matters. You lose sight of what's really important.

We also see this, at times, in the life of the church. As Christians, we know where our true allegiance lies. Indeed, our very name reveals the one in whom we trust and follow! And yet, sometimes we have this tendency to wave our Lutheran pom-poms a bit too much. We root for our building, our theology, our traditions, and our playbook. We struggle with welcoming "new players" who don't exactly fit the mold of our team... but then again, is the team really *ours* to begin with?

We don't need to compete with our Christian sisters and brothers of other denominations or even people of different faiths, for that matter! For we are all children of God and that, my friends, makes us teammates, not opponents. Jesus calls us to love freely and fully as we care for one another and serve those in need, and we are able to do this through his power at work in us! So "thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Cor. 15:57), a victory that uplifts us and sustains us until our journey is complete and that never-ending parade begins. As we sang at our Mighty Fortress VBS a few years back, "In Jesus, the victory's won! Share the news with everyone! The sacrifice of God's own Son – King of all salvation!" May we remain united always in the victory of his love.






