### A message from Pastor Alex:

Who are we as a church? What are we known for? I often find myself thinking about these questions when it comes to our life together here at St. John–Incarnation Lutheran Church. Do people really know *who* we are or do they simply know where we're located? After all, it's not hard to find us! With a big, beautiful building that's been at the corner of Peninsula and Merrick for decades, our location could not be more ideal and because of that everyone in Lynbrook, for the most part, knows where we are. "Oh, you're the church with the 'Open Sundays' sign!" I hear it all the time!

But how wonderful would it be if our neighbors and those in our community knew the ministry that we do here together? What if folks could see the various ways that we serve those in need and the difference that it makes in their lives? Our mission statement says that we are "followers of Christ who share God's unconditional love with all people through word and deed." We know who (and *whose*!) we are as the body of Christ, but what about our community? Do they know?

The New LIFE Center certainly knows who we are. Our congregation has faithfully supported this organization for many years through our donations of school supplies, baby items, and thousands of pounds of food. This ongoing, collaborative ministry has helped countless families in the Uniondale area and beyond.

Seafarers International House also knows us. The cookies tins and Christmas-at-Sea satchels that we send to SIH go directly to seafarers who cannot be home with their loved ones for the holidays. Port chaplains bring these items right onto the ships and as SIH states in their most recent newsletter, "What might otherwise have been another lonely night at sea becomes a joyous occasion, because complete strangers ashore have taken the time to share the spirit of Christmas with these otherwise forgotten seafarers!"

There is much to look forward to in the coming months here at St. John–Incarnation. We will celebrate our **40**<sup>th</sup> annual Harvest Festival at the end of September (let's all pray for sunshine that day!) with half of the proceeds going to local charities. On Sunday, September 23 following our worship, we will assemble personal care kits which will be sent to Lutheran World Relief as part of their 'Project Promise' for people/communities recovering from natural disasters as well as those who live in poverty. For the month of October, we will do a special food drive for the New LIFE Center. If we are able to collect 500 food items by the end of the month (and I have no doubt that we will), Thrivent will donate \$500 to the New LIFE Center as well! Finally, for November we will have another coat drive for The United Veterans Beacon House in Bay Shore. The last time we did this back in 2016, we collected about 80 coats and jackets which were given out to homeless veterans in the area to help keep them warm throughout the winter. Let's set a goal for 100 this time, if not more!

We know our mission here at St. John–Incarnation. We know that we have been called together to do God's work and to let our light shine. "We are blessed to be a blessing to others," we like to say in the church because, well, it's the truth! So as we consider the possibilities and opportunities that God has for us in 2019 and beyond, perhaps we might identify some ways that we can meet the needs of those right here in our neighborhood. How can we help? Who are "the least of these" in our midst? Where can we go out in peace and serve the Lord with our hands and feet? If we can keep our eyes, our ears, and our hearts open, I'm quite sure that God will lead us right to where we need to be.

Wouldn't it be great if we were more than just the church that's open Sundays? What if our community knew us as the church that feeds the hungry and clothes the naked, a place where all are welcomed and embraced? To quote an anthem that our choir has sung in the past, "They'll know we are Christians by our love." May that love always be visible and tangible here at St. John-Incarnation.

### St. John-Incarnation Lutheran Church Roof Fund Appeal

The Stewardship and Finance committee is officially starting an appeal to replace the roof above the old church which is above the knotty pine room, church office, council room and nursery. We expect that the roof will cost at least \$20,000.00. We have been awarded a Congregational Capital Improvement Challenge Grant from the Metropolitan New York Synod Council for \$9,000. In order to receive this grant, St. John–Incarnation must first raise \$9,000 as matching funds. We have \$5,000 left over from the air conditioner fund which we will transfer to the roof fund. We also have a very generous offer from someone who is willing to match dollar-for-dollar every donation that is made to our roof fund. This means we only need to raise about 25% of the total amount from our members and friends of St. John-Incarnation! Thanks be to God!

#### It is our hope and prayer that you will consider making a donation to the new roof. Donations can be made in "Memory of" or in "Honor of" anyone you wish to be remembered or honored. Donations will be shared each month in our Messenger.
