A Message from Pastor Alex:

It was two years ago this month that COVID-19 entered our lives and changed practically everything we knew and took for granted. So many events, activities, and gatherings were either postponed or cancelled altogether, and here at SJILC it was no different. Yes, we were able to adapt quickly and move our worship to a virtual format thanks in large part to Joey Bahadur (without him, we might have missed more than just the one week of worship that we did in mid-March!), and then later that summer we switched over to Zoom, which we have been using ever since.

This new way of worshipping certainly had its fair share of challenges, and we know that nothing can replicate the physical gathering of God's people around Word and Sacrament. However, this technology did allow us to still be together during a very scary and uncertain time, and because of it our congregation has grown a lot these past two years as we've been able to connect with lots of people who we wouldn't have been able to reach before! Praise the Lord!

Well, now that the worst is behind us, we are finally ready to move forward and get back to some semblance of normalcy! The first step is getting rid of those dreaded face coverings. At our meeting this past week, the council approved lifting our mask requirement that we've had in place throughout this entire pandemic. Yes, you read that correctly – wearing a mask is now optional! We'll still have them available in the narthex for those who want or need them, and if you're not feeling well, I will continue to kindly ask that you please stay home that day and join us on Zoom.

We will also be resuming our annual hymn tournament, which we had to cancel in 2020. You may remember that we only got through the first round before COVID hit so for the sake of ease, we'll just start over with the same hymns that we had in 2020. If you're unfamiliar with this, hymns are matched up in a bracket style tournament similar to the "March Madness" college basketball tournament. You pick the hymn(s) you want to win by donating spare change and cash into designated cups. We begin with 16 hymns, which will "tip-off" on Sunday, March 20, and after four weeks, a winner will be chosen on Sunday, April 10 that we will sing once a month for the next year. All donations will go to our evangelism & outreach ministry for future programs and events.


Another tradition at SJILC is our annual bowling outing, which we were not able to do last year. In the past, we have bowled at our usual spot in Rockville Centre, but it appears that bowling is quite popular at Maple Lanes right now, which isn't surprising! Finally, in addition to our regular Sunday worship, midweek services will be held during Lent on Thursday evenings at 7:30pm. We will once again be using Marty Haugen's Holden Evening Prayer for these services, and our theme for this Lent will be "Open My Life, Lord." If you've never experienced Holden Evening Prayer, I highly recommend it! In my humble opinion, it's one of the most moving and beautiful liturgies ever composed.

It has been said that "March comes in like a lion and goes out like a lamb." This old adage refers to the weather that we typically experience in the northern parts of our country like here in New York, and while we managed to avoid a "roaring" snowstorm at the start of this month, we know from experience that when it comes to the weather, anything is possible in March! Nevertheless, whether we go out with some "gentle" temperatures or not, we know that Lent is taking us to a different kind of lamb – the Lamb of God who takes away our sin and that of the whole world. Will you join me on this journey to the cross of Christ? It won't be easy and we may find ourselves wanting to take a different path, but by the grace of God we'll make it together.

May the Lord be with you in this Lenten season. See you in worship!
