A Message from Pastor Alex:

"Wait for the Lord; be strong and let your heart take courage; wait for the Lord!" - Ps. 27:4

As we prepare for another Christmas and the celebration of Christ's birth, we find ourselves again in this familiar time of waiting. We all know what it feels like to wait... and wait... and wait some more! How long must we keep waiting!? Sometimes it can feel like forever!

We do *a lot* of waiting too if you really think about it! We wait in lines at the grocery store and the post office. We wait on the phone ("please hold for the next available agent") while listening to the same song over and over again. I know some of you have waited many hours in the emergency room, which probably tested your patience, and speaking of patience not patients, we even have designated waiting rooms, whether it's at the hospital, the doctor's office, the dentist, the veterinarian, or the DMV. We wait for the light to turn green, the traffic to clear up, the school bus or train to arrive, and our flight to board and depart. Sometimes we even have to wait to use the bathroom!

Now for the most part, situations like these are merely an inconvenience, and while it may be a little annoying that we have to wait, like it or not, we know it's still necessary. After all, you can't just jump to the front of the line, right? If everyone did that, nobody would be helped! And besides, now that we have things like Netflix, EZ-Pass, Amazon and online banking, just to name a few, our "wait time" in many respects has never been better!

That being said, waiting can also be a real burden, especially when it's prolonged and filled with uncertainty. The longer we wait, the more likely we are to worry: why aren't they home yet or answering their phone? What will the test results show? Will I (or my loved one) ever get better? These are the moments when our faith is really challenged, and it's even harder and more frustrating when there doesn't seem to be any end in sight. For almost two years now we've been waiting for this pandemic to end, and with new variants and positive cases rising again, unfortunately it appears that we're going to have one more winter of covid-related discontent ahead of us. At least this year we'll be able to gather in-person for our Christmas Eve worship, which obviously was not the case 12 months ago.

Yes, my dear friends, not all waiting is bad. Sometimes waiting can be good and even exciting, and the anticipation that we feel reminds us that whatever (or whoever) we're waiting for will certainly be worth the wait – birthdays, holidays, weekends, vacations, family reunions and getting together with friends, your wedding day, your favorite team playing in the big game, the kids coming home from college, your spouse or significant other returning from a trip, and, of course, the birth of a child. Being able to finally see and hold my precious nephew Shepherd for the first time after all that waiting was a special moment that I'll never forget.

So as we wait and watch for the Lord in this Advent season, let us remember the words of the Psalmist who also writes, "I wait for the Lord, my soul waits, and in his word I put my hope." (Ps. 130). Yes, our hope rests in the birth of a child who is God's love incarnate – the word made flesh who was born to us, lived among us, and died for us and for our salvation, even while we were still sinners! Our hope also rests in the promise of the resurrection knowing that there will, indeed, come a day when crying and pain and death will be no more. This is the good news of great joy for <u>all</u> people, and we can hold onto this hope because our God is always faithful. As we sing in the words of the hymn, "Canticle of the Turning": "My soul cries out with a joyful shout that the God of my heart is great, and my spirit sings of the wondrous things that you bring to the ones who wait."


May God bring you and your loved ones a blessed and hope-filled Christmas. And remember, Christ, the light of the world, is on the way!


