Pastor's Reflection~

Included elsewhere in this edition of *The Messenger* is my formal resignation letter, which was sent to the members of St. John's in June. It is reprinted here for those who are friends or "alumni" of the congregation. However, I would be remiss if I did not write some additional words to you for this, my final *Messenger* reflection.

First, my deep thanks to all of you who have allowed me the privilege of serving as your pastor over the past five years. It has been a great blessing to me to begin my ordained life in a congregation that was willing to let me grow and learn how to do this pastor thing and was also willing to grow and learn with me. Together we've tried many new things – new musical settings of the liturgy, new hymns, additional worship times, new worship styles (Holden Evening Prayer and our recent worship in the park, for example), a new Sunday school curriculum – and that's just a few off the top of my head! We've also expanded our understanding of who our neighbors are and the ways that we reach out to share God's love with those in need, whether that be through donations of school supplies or Christmas gifts and tins of cookies for Seafarers or coat and clothing drives; we even agreed to be a host or support congregation for a program to house homeless families! (The program we were going to work with didn't quite get out of the organization stage here in Nassau County, but maybe you'll have another similar opportunity in the future, and I hope you'll embrace it!) We've weathered some difficult economic times, both as a country and as a congregation. While there is still much to do in that area, St. John's is actually on more stable financial footing now in terms of a balanced budget, thanks to your faithful giving and the creative and sacrificial efforts of the many involved in managing the church's expenses.

Alongside all of the work we've done on a congregational level, I have also been honored to walk with many of you in a more personal, individual way: preparing for marriages, baptizing infants and children (and 1 adult!), teaching confirmation, and presiding at funerals. In times of joy and sorrow, I have been glad to walk with you through the ages and stages of life and to share the word and witness of God's deep, never-ending love with you.

I will always remember and thank God for the people of St. John's and the ways you have supported and loved me and my family, especially at the birth of Norah and our announcement of the impending arrival of Baby Fetters #2 (who is, by the way, a boy – and don't worry. We'll be sure to send pictures after he is born sometime in October!).

As I prepare to leave, my prayer for St. John's is that this time of transition between pastors will be a fruitful one, as you discern together who God is calling St. John's to be in the next 100 years and who best will help to lead you into God's future and mission. God is already preparing your next pastor for you and you for her or him. I will be praying for you and your new pastor in this time, and will rejoice with you when you begin your work together!

Dear people of God at St. John's,

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

It is with a mixture of sadness and anticipation that I write to inform you that I am resigning from my call as pastor of St. John's Lutheran Church, effective July 15.

Many of you know that my husband Andy has been in the call process since January. While we had originally hoped that he might find a church near enough to allow me to remain at St. John's, God the Holy Spirit had other plans. Andy has accepted a call to a church in Waukesha, Wisconsin. We are grateful that he has found a congregation that is a good fit for his gifts, abilities, and interests, even as we are sad that it will take us far from people we have come to know and love over the past five (almost) years. After we move, I will go on leave from call in order to focus on our family, especially as we look forward to the birth of our second child in October.

Andy, Norah, the pets, and I plan to make the move to Wisconsin during the last week of June. Following a few weeks to move and settle in, I will return to Lynbrook to preside at a wedding, and my last day with you in worship will be July 15.

Times of pastoral vacancy are always filled with questions as congregations wonder what the next steps are and what the future might hold. I will work closely with the congregational council and other leaders in these next weeks to help to plan for this vacancy. Rev. Kathleen Koran, Assistant to the Bishop for Congregations, will also be working with the council, and will preach and preside at worship on Sunday, July 8. She will then be available to meet with individuals after worship to help answer your questions, explain the next steps in this process, and inform you about what you can expect from the synod as St. John's goes through a time of exploring and discerning what gifts and skills this congregation most needs from its next pastor.

Thank you for your support, encouragement, openness, and constructive criticism over the past several years. St. John's has been a wonderful congregation for me to begin my ministry as an ordained pastor. I have learned many things, have grown as a leader and in my own faith, and have experienced the love of God expressed through all of you. I have loved being the pastor of St. John's, and will miss you all. Please keep our family in your prayers, as we will keep the people and congregation of St. John's in ours.

LETTER TO CONGREGATION CONCERNING COVENANT

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Pastor Becky Fetters and the Congregation Council have prayerfully signed a covenant, which helps us understand our relationship with one another as we move forward without her.

When a pastor leaves a congregation, it is not appropriate for her to continue to function in the pastoral role. This is difficult and sometimes painful for us to understand. However, if we remember that part of our calling as the people of God is to care for the body of Christ and not injure different members of it, we might find it easier to accept. For instance, if a pastor does a funeral for Jane because she was so special, why won't the pastor perform a baptism for Joe's family? It's easy to see how hurt feelings would not only affect Joe's feelings towards the former pastor but perhaps also feelings within the body of Christ between Jane's family and Joe's family.

It is important for us to understand that as of July 15, 2012, Pastor Becky is no longer our pastor, but she will pray for our continued and future mission and ministry and for a strong and fruitful partnership with our future pastoral leader.

Therefore, Pastor Becky **cannot**:

- come back to perform weddings, funerals, or baptisms;
- visit the sick and the homebound;
- continue in any counseling relationship with a parishioner;
- be involved in any way in the call process (helping with the profile, recommending candidates, commenting on a particular candidate);
- support or give advice to anyone involved in a congregational disagreement;
- return and lead worship services (unless down the road she is invited back as a "former pastor" to participate in special events, such as a church anniversary).

This does not mean that friendships developed must come to an end, but the relationship to pastor and parishioner will no longer continue.

We give thanks to God for the time Pastor Becky was with us, and we pray for her as she now goes forth to serve God and the church in new ways. We trust that God will send us a new leader who will be different but called to serve God and the ministry of this congregation for the next stage of our ministry.

Chris Powell will be attending Farmingdale College pursuing a degree in Professional Communications.


