

*For I was hungry and you gave me food,
I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink,
I was a stranger and you welcomed me.
~ Matthew 25:16 ~*

Have you ever experienced hunger in your life? I'm not talking about feeling hungry; we've all had the growling stomach from not eating enough or missing a meal. No, I mean real hunger. Actual starvation. Being so severely famished that your body is debilitated and dysfunctional. Do you have any idea what that's like? I certainly do not, and my guess is that you don't either.

We are very fortunate that the experience of hunger is foreign to us, that we've never suffered such a painful craving for sustenance. Sure, we may take part in periods of fasting like during the season of Lent, but that's not hunger. That's a choice to be temporarily hungry. A decision that we make freely knowing that we can start eating again whenever the discomfort becomes too much to bear.

But there is nothing intentional about those who hunger. When food is scarce or inaccessible, opportunities to eat are few and far between. Thus, instead of having the luxury of choosing *when* to eat or *what* to eat like we have, people who hunger are constantly faced with this frightening dilemma: HOW are we going to eat?

This is where our call to discipleship becomes vital as we remind ourselves that following Christ is much more than just proclaiming the Gospel. The author of the book of James tells us that without action, our faith accomplishes very little: "If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, and you say to them, 'Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill,' and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that?"

There isn't much good in that, and that's why our church commits itself to reach out and share God's unconditional love to the poor, especially those who hunger. Aside from the money that we give to ELCA World Hunger, one of our strongest ministries here at St. John's is our food pantry. Last year, we donated 1,317 lbs of food to the New LIFE Center in Uniondale, which given the size of our congregation, is pretty amazing! I commend you for your faithful generosity, and I encourage you to continue to bring in those canned goods and non-perishables. There are many people and families in our community who need them.

I'm also very excited to share that we are in the beginning stages of planting a vegetable garden, which is located behind the parsonage. This endeavor is being led by our very own Elizabeth Hanson and will serve as her Silver Award project for Girl Scouts. Elizabeth really wants to help people who are hungry and this garden will provide fresh vegetables for her to accomplish just that. Please offer her your encouragement and support. This will be a wonderful new ministry for our congregation in the years to come!


