A Message from Pastor Alex:



*“The bright summer had passed away,
and gorgeous autumn was flinging its rainbow-tints of beauty on hill and dale.”*

There is so much that I love about fall. I love the cooler temperatures and breathing in that crisp autumn air. I love how the leaves change from green to various shades of yellow, red, orange, and purple in all their splendor and how they glisten on a bright sunny day when the sky is clear and perfectly blue. I love getting together with my family and friends for Thanksgiving, not to mention everything else that comes with that special holiday from the parade and dog show to the food and football! And speaking of dogs, I also love and enjoy blessing our pets every fall, which is always a *treat* for me even if it isn't for all of them. I love taking part in our annual Harvest Festival here at SJILC. Hopefully, come next October we'll be able to enjoy some brats and baked goods again! And then, of course, as I mentioned above, there's football. Whether it's rooting for my favorite college team, Penn State, on Saturdays or my beloved Eagles on Sundays (or even playing in “turkey bowls” around Thanksgiving when I'm thankful just to avoid injury!), football and fall go together for me like peanut butter and jelly.

Now I wish I could say that I love *everything* about fall, and given all the gushing I've done so far, it probably appears that way! The truth is, however, there's one big thing that I actually *loathe* about this season and that's the **darkness**. With the days getting shorter and the nights growing longer, it's easy to feel a bit discouraged around this time of year. Sure, gaining that extra hour of sleep on that first Sunday in November is pretty sweet, but it's definitely not worth the three long months that follow when the sun goes down before dinner. The lack of sunlight can be challenging for many of us, especially once it gets cold and we're forced to stay inside for the most part. In fact, I remember days in high school during winter when I barely saw any sunlight at all except through some windows! I'd stay after school for a game, practice, or meeting, and by the time I was done and leaving the building, it was already dark again. Ugh.

No, it's not easy living in darkness. I can't even imagine being somewhere like Barrow, Alaska where there's no sunlight for two months straight during winter! And yet, regardless of the weather or season, we've all had those days (and nights) when the mind is restless, the heart is troubled, and it feels like we're stuck in the shadows. Fear, worry, doubt, grief, guilt and despair only add to the darkness. I know I've wandered through some dark valleys in my life and ministry, and I've had the immense privilege of accompanying many of you through some of your darkest and most trying moments too. My faith is always tested, to be sure, and the struggle is very real. I feel like the Psalmist in Psalm 22: “O my God, I cry out by day, but you do not answer; and by night, but I find no rest.”

How do I endure? What carries me through? I take it to the Lord in prayer and remember God's unfailing promises. I remember the reassuring words of the very next psalm, Psalm 23, that even though we often find ourselves walking in the shadow of darkness and death, we don't need to be afraid, for the Lord is always with us. He loves us, cares for us, and gives us the gift of his peace – a peace that nothing can destroy, not even death!

“The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness – on them light has shined.” (Isaiah 9:2) As we approach Advent and these longest nights of the year, we look and listen for the one who says, “I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life.” (John 8:12) Yes, with every fall and winter comes another spring. The sun will rise again just like the Son who is risen indeed! For as John's gospel also reminds us, “The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.” (John 1:5)

Until then, we give thanks for the gift of light that illuminates our world and for God's word that illumines our lives in every season: “Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path.” (Psalm 119:105) Indeed, we trust that the light of Christ is not only with us but *within* us too, and we are called to let that light shine whenever and wherever it's needed.

I love that we get to be that light for others and I'm so grateful for those times when you have been that light for me. Sharing God's love with those who find themselves in darkness is really what we're all about here at SJILC: feeding the hungry, clothing the naked, providing shelter to the homeless, praying for the sick and suffering, supporting one another through our grief and struggles, and so much more. As I often say in worship, “**we are blessed to be a blessing.**” We give because we have received so much. This will be our theme for this year's Commitment Sunday, which will take place on Sunday, November 21. I hope you'll be able to join us that morning as together we will commit ourselves once again to the mission we share here at St. John–Incarnation Lutheran Church.

To quote a verse from the hymn, “Will You Let Me Be Your Servant”,
*I will hold the Christ-light for you in the nighttime of your fear;
I will hold my hand out to you, speak the peace you long to hear.*

All donations need to be returned no later than Sunday, December 5th. Gifts can be returned, unwrapped, in any of the following ways:

- Call the phone numbers as listed above for pick up of your gifts.
